Museum für Naturkunde Berlin

If your family is fascinated by all things prehistoric, the Berlin Natural History Museum is somewhere you won't want to miss! Here, you can admire the skeletons of dinosaurs including a brachiosaurus (from the Jurassic period) or an archaeopteryx fossil (an extremely rare bird). The museum also houses a collection of meteorites and stuffed animals.

Extavium

This interactive museum invites children and adults alike to embark on an extraordinary journey to the heart of science. Here, you can experiment with anything! Overseen by researchers, children can carry out their own experiments, understand how the brain works and create their very own tornados! This vast laboratory covering an area of 1,500 m² is entirely dedicated to helping children and teenagers to understand science by building photovoltaic cells, practising kitchen chemistry, making a mouse maze, and more!

Zoo Berlin

Berlin zoo was founded in 1844 and covers an area of 35 hectares. It is one of the world's largest zoological gardens, with more than 1,500 different species. Here, you can discover a number of extremely rare animals, including birds such as the cassowary, the condor and the harpy eagle. Promoting the reproduction of endangered species, such as Przewalski's horse, is also one of the zoo's specialities. In 1913, the Berlin aquarium – Germany's largest – was opened within the zoo grounds. Small children will love the Streichelzoo ('petting zoo'), where they can take a close-up look at farm animals, including goats, geese and donkeys.






Computerspielemuseum
