Mucem

Midway between sky and sea, this museum is dedicated to the cultures of Europe and the Mediterranean, and is unique in the world. More than a museum, Mucem is a true cultural gem. Extending over 1,600 m2, discover the great phases in history of the civilisations that have lived and thrived in and around the Mediterranean. Throughout the year, the museum presents temporary exhibitions as well as conferences, films, documentaries, shows, etc. A fun interactive trail also invites children to travel around the Mediterranean, stopping off at seven different places to examine a selection of objects from the museum, accompanied by many characters: kings, sultans, pirates, doges or merchants who will unveil their secrets along the way.

Préau des Accoules

At the heart of Marseille old town, in the former hall of the Académie de Marseille, the Préau des Accoules offers a space dedicated to young visitors. The Préau collaborates with the Museums of Marseille to devise innovative educational trails around the Museums' high-quality objects so that the rich reservoir of collections they hold can be explored effectively by the children. Everything has been designed to ensure that their first visit to the museum is fun and full of discoveries that will encourage them to come back again and again. The Préau des Accoules thus aims to be a museum 'playground' where children can contemplate, dream and come into contact with new things as their curiosity is piqued.

Petit Train de Marseille

Two lovely train rides await adults and children alike when you clim aboard the Petit Train de Marseille (Marseille's miniature train) to discover the city, steeped in history. The first tour takes you past the Vieux Port (Old Port) and on to the Notre Dame de la Garde basilica via a coastal road that runs past the sea. You can admire sights such as Fort St Nicolas and the Palais du Pharo before reaching La Bonne Mère at 162 metres of altitude. The second tour takes you into Marseille's old quarters, where you will see the Hôtel de Cabre, the Hôtel Dieu, the Cathédrale de la Major, etc.
