Bioparco di Roma

Situated within the grounds of the Villa Borghese, the Bioparco zoo extends over 17 hectares and is home to more than a thousand animals, including hippos, lions, monkeys, giraffes and elephants. It also has a reptile section and an aviary. During the summer holidays, Bioparco organises camps for children aged 4-13, who will have the chance to observe the zoo animals every day and find out more about their habits, while caring for some farm animals along the way!

Zoomarine

Located to the south-west of Rome and a mere 500 metres from the Tyrrhenian Sea, Zoomarine is a zoological park/ oceanarium as well as an amusement park. This unique place regards the protection of nature as an important part of its work, and has a veterinary clinic and a rehabilitation centre for stranded animals. Visitors can observe over 20 different aquatic species at Zoomarine and enjoy 2 extraordinary sights: the dolphinarium and the seal show.






Bici & Baci
