Experience a fascinating underwater world – in the heart of Vienna! The Haus des Meeres Aqua Terra Zoo, Austria's biggest aquarium, features a 50-metre-high tower of amazingly colourful and varied sea life. Sharks, rays and vast numbers of fish swim side by side, while turtles, crocodiles, snakes, lizards, flying fox bats, monkeys and insects can also be observed here.

It has four separate areas for different age groups: Ocean for ages 0-6, a Hands-On Exhibition for ages 6-12, a Workshop Playground for ages 3-12 and a Special Effects Film Studio for ages 8-14.

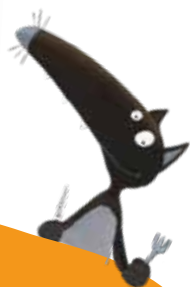
Dschungel Café
