## Museum für Naturkunde Berlin

If your family is fascinated by all things prehistoric, the Berlin Natural History Museum is a must-visit! Here, you can admire the skeletons of dinosaurs including a brachiosaurus (from the Jurassic period) or an archaeopteryx fossil (an extremely rare bird). The museum also houses a collection of meteorites and stuffed animals.

## NANO Science Center

This interactive museum invites children and adults alike to embark on an extraordinary journey to the heart of science. Here, you can experiment with anything! Overseen by researchers, children can carry out their own experiments, understand how the brain works and create their very own tornadoes! This vast laboratory covering an area of 1,500 m<sup>2</sup> is entirely dedicated to helping children and teenagers to understand science by building photovoltaic cells, practising kitchen chemistry, making a mouse maze, and more!

## Zoo Berlin

Zoo Berlin was founded in 1844 and covers an area of about 35 hectares. It is not only the oldest and most visited zoo in Germany, but also one of the most species-rich zoos in the world, with more than 1,000 different species. Its inhabitants include the only giant pandas in Germany. Zoo Berlin is part of a global network and is involved in projects all over the world through its "Berlin World Wild" species conservation program, for example with the rhinoceroses in Assam or the western lowland gorillas in the Republic of Congo. The petting zoo and the numerous adventure playgrounds are particularly popular with children, as are the commented feedings and keeper talks about the exotic animal inhabitants. Directly adjacent to the zoo is Aquarium Berlin, one of the most famous aquariums in Europe.
