For more than a century, the Grévin Museum holds more than 3,000 wax models. With its reproductions of historical figures (Louis XIV, Mozart, etc.) and contemporary celebrities (Kylian Mbappé, Lady Gaga, etc.), the Grévin Museum is a three-dimensional history book and a window onto current issues. There is also a space specifically designed for children, enabling even the youngest visitors to see their favourite characters – Scrat from *Ice Age*, Obelix, and even Spiderman – as well as cartoon characters like Titeuf!

Immerse yourself in a rich educational experience with a visit to the Palais de la Porte Dorée, which houses both the Tropical Aquarium and the National Museum of the History of Immigration (National Museum of the History of Immigration). The Palais de la Porte Dorée presents the history of this iconic Art Deco monument alongside exhibitions on France's colonial past and the history of immigration. The Tropical Aquarium, meanwhile, offers visitors the chance to observe tropical species up close and learn about the importance of conserving their natural habitats.

Moulin de la Tour

Embark on a journey back through time with a visit to this authentic Parisian windmill, fully restored and designated a Monument Historique since 1979. This medieval structure is characteristic of the stone windmills of the period, with storeys that decrease in size as they ascend. Inside, visitors can view the complete grain-grinding machinery alongside numerous detailed historical documents.

Restoration work began in 1976 with the relocation of the mill—its tower weighs approximately 315 tonnes. The project was completed in 1991 with the installation of the milling mechanism and the system used to turn the structure to face the wind.



Aquarium of Paris

Located in the heart of Paris, in the Trocadéro Gardens, the Aquarium of Paris is one of the most spectacular aquariums in Europe. It is home to numerous species native to the French coasts—both in metropolitan France and the overseas territories—including several species of shark. Visitors have the opportunity to take part in a wide range of activities, such as feeding the sharks, meeting a diver, or touching select species in a tactile pool. The aquarium also features two cinema screens, themed exhibitions, educational programs, and creative workshops.

Jardin d'Acclimatation

Designed under the reign of Emperor Napoleon III, the Jardin d'Acclimatation is the capital's only amusement park and the first of its kind in France. Opened in 1860 and fully renovated in 2018, it welcomes nearly two million visitors annually to its 42 attractions and 18 hectares of landscaped gardens. Set within a unique historical environment that attracts both locals and international tourists, the park combines heritage with modernity: a contemporary amusement park, 13 restaurants and food trucks, expansive lawns for picnics, and even a farm and aviary home to 400 animals and birds.

Visitors of all ages can enjoy the skate parks and play areas, while the lawns and meadows offer a peaceful retreat for those looking to relax.
